Levels Decoded

IL – illustrated books (intended for read-aloud to younger readers / may be at 2-3 reading level)

1 – beginning readers (I Can Read books)

2 - intermediate readers (big print, more pictures, shorter length than level 3)

3 – advanced readers (suitable for upper grammar & dialectical)

4 – mature readers (suitable for rhetorical, due to length or content)

While the longer list is ideal if you want to cover every subject in read-alouds or need variety to match your library system, this booklist focuses on the titles I most highly recommend, to maximize your time if you have lots of little ones or want to simply purchase a few titles for the year.
