Year 3 – Graphic Novels & Easier Reads

Focus: Progressing Readers (2-3) / Upper Elementary – Middle School

Levels Decoded

- IL illustrated books (young readers booklist)
- 1 beginning readers (I can read books)
- 2 intermediate readers (bigger print, more pictures, shorter length than level 3)
- 3 advanced readers (suitable for upper grammar & dialectical)
- 4 mature readers (suitable for rhetorical, due to length or content)

Books are ordered according to quarters. When considering if a graphic novel is the right level for your student, look to the length of the book. Also be sure to consider the content – these titles contain nothing I would deem inappropriate but Shakespeare and Dickens have some mature content. Generally, these books are great for independent readers in elementary and middle school, especially those who want an older looking book but are still emerging readers, loving and reading series like Magic Treehouse and the harder I-Can-Read books while beginning to move into true chapter books. Graphic novels are grouped first and longer novels are marked with *.

Who are we kidding? The middle school reader and many rhetoric students would love these too. 🤓
